Two Types of Shadows

box-shadow:

simulates a drop shadow - a copy of the object with its position offset horizontally and vertically

text-shadow:

an exact copy of the text with its position offset horizontally and vertically

Shadow Property Values

The following rules apply to both box-shadow and text-shadow. Give 4 values separated by spaces:

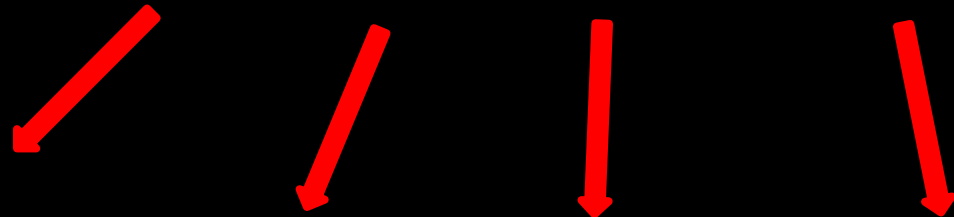
box-shadow: 5px -7px 6px #ff0012;

x-offset

y-offset

blur radius

color



Multiple Shadows

You can give an element more than one shadow. Separate each group of shadow values with a comma

example:

```
text-shadow: 1px 1px 1px gray,  
            2px 2px 1px gray,  
            3px 3px 1px gray;
```
