<u>If - Statement:</u>

A control structure that allows programmers to make decisions

<u>boolean:</u>

A value that can be true or false

<u>comparison operator</u>: a symbol that <u>compares</u> two values

Definitions

logical operator:

a symbol that links two or more booleans into a larger boolean statement

We have symbols that represent and or

And

symbol: &&

rules:

If both sides are true, the whole expression is true Otherwise, the whole expression is false

example:

```
if(age > 12 && age <= 19) {
  console.log("You are a teenager");
}</pre>
```

Or

```
symbol:

rules:

If either side is true, the whole expression is true Only if both sides are false is the whole expression false

example:

```
if(letter == "a" || letter == "e") {
  console.log("Letter is a vowel");
}
```
